## IARI Hosts 5-Day Training on Mushroom Cultivation for Sustainable Agribusiness



Schemes and Funding Access, Cost-Benefit Analysis and Startup Opportunities in the Mushroom Sector.





On August 28, participants visited a progressive mushroom farm in Sonipat, Haryana, for hands-on exposure to real-world cultivation and processing. The visit enriched their understanding of commercial farm operations, from substrate preparation to marketing.
